Dear Parents/Guardian of Secondary 3 students,

1 I trust that our Sec 3 students have been sharing with you their highlights of school life from Term 1. Just before we ended Term 1, the Sec 3 students organised a self-run carnival for their peers and teachers to end the term on a high note. However, it was not all just fun and games for them. Through the month-long planning process, our students got the opportunity to better understand their own strengths, and how they could serve to be a positive influence and contributor in a real-world context. Making their vision for the carnival come alive required them to tap on their self and team leadership skills to the fullest as they tackled the inevitable complex scenarios which arose when individuals come together. We know these formative experiences will instill in them lifelong values and attitudes, beyond academic learning.

2 Many of them are or will soon be taking on leadership roles, and I hope the experience has served them well in learning how to manage their own emotions, thoughts and behaviour. I look forward to their continued growth as individuals and their contribution to our vibrant learning community.

Remediation for Identified Students

5 From Term 2 Week 2 to Week 9 (except 25 April, 7 May, 9 May and 16 May), subject teachers will hold remedial classes on Tuesday and Thursday with identified students who will benefit from additional academic support. The duration of each session is 1 hour, from 3:30 pm to 4:30 pm. Meet-the-Parents Session (Thursday 28 March 2024)

6 As part of our continuous effort to enhance communication and partnership between you and the school, we would like to invite you to attend the Secondary Three Meet-the-Parents session on Thursday 28 March 2024, from 6.00pm to 7.00pm, online via Zoom.

7 The programme includes an address by Vice-Principal, a briefing on Education and Career Guidance (ECG) and Post-Secondary Pathways for Students as well as a sharing by Year Head on Stress Management. More information regarding the Meet-the-Parents session will be put up on Parent Gateway.

Well-being Week (Monday 1 April to Friday 5 April 2024)

8 CTSS Well-being week aims to educate students on their self-management of personal well-being, both psychologically and physically. We hope that Clementeens will learn, start and sustain healthy psychological and physical habits through a series of informative activities that will be conducted during ASPIRE Time, recess and lessons. The series of activities will be led by Student Leaders, for Clementeens by Clementeens.

9 In the area of cultivating good physical habits, Clementeens will learn to be mindful of the food we consume. They will also have the opportunities to participate in exercise challenges during recess to keep their body active and explore the use of Target Games to bring about positive emotions.

10 To enhance psychological well-being, Clementeens will learn to focus on strengthening their resilience through thought reframing process, self-care as well as showing care and support for others.

International Friendship Week (Monday 8 April to Thursday 11 April 2024)

11 International Friendship Day helps the world to overcome its challenges and complexity using the most basic form of human solidarity, friendship.

12 The theme for International Friendship Day this year is *Singapore in Asia*. Asia is made up of colourful and diverse cultures. Mutual understanding of each other's culture helps to promote regional peace through the acknowledgement and respect of cultural differences within the region.

13 This year, for International Friendship Day, students will get the opportunity to appreciate the culture of selected ASEAN countries through engaging booth activities during recesses. Character and Citizenship Education (CCE) lesson will also portray how countries within the region help each other through different situations, highlighting the cooperation and solidarity of ASEAN.

Sec 2 to 5 Student Leadership Meeting (Tuesday 9 April 2024)

14 A Student Leadership Meeting has been scheduled on the afternoon of Tuesday April 9, where Student Leaders will reflect on their past year, providing an opportunity for them to share insights and learnings with each other. They will also be acknowledging the contributions of outgoing seniors, and expressing gratitude for their dedicated service.

Cyberwellness Week (Monday 15 April to Friday 19 April 2024)

15 CTSS Cyber Wellness Week aims to reinforce the key cyber wellness messages in our Clementeens through recess activities and sharing by Student Leaders. This year, the school will focus on the Digital Well-being of our Clementeens to reinforce the following messages:

- Embrace the affordances of technology while maintaining a balanced lifestyle between offline and online activities.
- Be a safe and responsible user of technology and maintain a positive online presence.
- Be responsible for personal well-being in cyberspace.

16 Through the activities, our Clementeens will have the opportunities to be aware of their digital wellness and online habits, from which they will then be able to work on sustainable online habits to ensure their Digital Well-being. The assembly programme by Cyber Security Agency of Singapore on "CyberSavvy, A Safe Journey" as well as the "Be Cyber Safe" Pop-Up will also focus on the importance of cybersecurity and cyber tips to adopt.

17 CTSS is celebrating our 44th Speech and Prize-Giving Day on Friday 26 April 2024. We are honoured to invite our present and past Clementeens who are prize winners, as well as their parents and guardians to attend the ceremony. Our Sec 2 and 3 Prize Giving Ceremony will be held during ASPIRE Time on 29 April and 6 May 2024 respectively. We look forward to celebrating the successes of all our Clementeens on that day.

Secondary 3 Higher Mother Tongue Languages Oral Exams (3 May to 9 May)

20 The Leadership Handover Ceremony will be held on the morning of Thursday 23 May 2024, as part of the end of term programme. This event aims to acknowledge the dedication and leadership demonstrated by our Upper Secondary Student Leaders over the past year. It signifies a significant moment where the present leaders take a step back, paving the way for the incoming leaders to assume their roles. We eagerly anticipate commemorating the accomplishments and development of our Clementeens during this ceremony.

Sec 1 to 3 Student Leadership Camp (Monday 27 May to Tuesday 28 May 2024)

21 There will be a mandatory Student Leadership Camp from Monday 27 May to Tuesday 28 May 2024 for all newly appointed Student Leaders and Executive Committee members of the new Student Union. The primary focus of the camp is to empower our Student Leaders with essential skills and knowledge required for their roles in the upcoming year. The camp will also emphasize on fostering team bonding through interactive activities to welcome the new members to the Student Union as they embark on various learning journeys and engage in service learning activities as a team.

8th Biennial School Musical (End of Term 2)

22 At the end of Term 2, we will be putting up our 8th biennial school musical, *Dear You*. The musical is a six-month long journey that seeks to teach our students good lessons of empathy, respect and perseverance. Students, staff and alumni are involved in the production as cast, crew or creatives, allowing them to showcase and develop their talents in their areas of interest. While the Drama Club leads this production, the rest of the school was invited to join in various roles. More details on the show will be provided nearing the date. We hope for our students, if they are not involved in the production, to attend the show as part of their aesthetics exposure, and to support their friends and schoolmates.

Promoting Punctuality

23 Punctuality is an important habit that contributes to academic success and personal development. By arriving on time, students cultivate a sense of responsibility and discipline, setting the tone for a productive day of learning.

24 The morning flag raising ceremony begins at 7:35 am and thus all Clementeens must be at the designated assembly area (school hall / quadrangle / classroom) at **7:30 am**. We appreciate your partnership in emphasising the value of being punctual and contribute to creating a positive learning environment.

Safety and Security Related Matters

25 The school appreciates that the majority of our parents/guardians are cooperative and partners with us in ensuring the safety and security of our staff and students. We would like to remind parents/guardians on the following:

- a. Visitor Declaration. To enable the accounting of all visitors into the school compound, all visitors must register their particulars at the Security Guard Post. Do show our Security Guards any ID which can proof your identification. Upon clearance by the security guards, visitors **MUST** display the school visitor's sticker prominently on the upper right side of the shirt/blouse.

- b. No Parking/Waiting at the Foyer. Please be reminded that the road along the foyer is meant to be a drop-off/pick-up point and not for parking or waiting. Parents/guardians can park their vehicles at Carpark A if your child/ward is not ready to board the vehicle. Do wait for your child inside the car and not at the foyer area.

26 We would like to underscore the importance of attendance for our end of term activities. With the recent removal of Mid-Year Exam, schools have been encouraged to redesign the learning experiences for our students. In line with this, the school has put in place end of term cohort activities to enrich our Clementeens learning experiences and support the achievement of important learning objectives within the curriculum.

27 The end of term cohort activities aim to extend learning beyond the regular classroom-based learning to provide students with real-world applications of their knowledge. This approach reinforces academic understanding and foster collaboration and problem-solving skills. Therefore, it is imperative that students attend and participate actively in these activities. Your support in ensuring their attendance and participation will greatly contribute to their holistic growth and academic success.
