

Life-long Learning Programme



Every Clementeen has the potential to become a compassionate leader, equipped with the confidence to lead and the humility to serve. At the heart of our Life-long Learning Programme is a steadfast commitment to cultivating leadership qualities, with an emphasis on Community Youth Leadership. This programme aims to harness the innate potential of our youth, empowering them to drive positive change within their communities and the environment.

Our student leadership programme is anchored in our school values and adopts the Leadership Challenge Model as its framework. Through meticulously designed training sessions and authentic learning experiences, our goal extends beyond imparting leadership skills and endeavours to help our students discover their unique strengths, passions, and talents.



Clementeens who demonstrate a desire and aptitude for serving the school community are provided with opportunities to enhance their student leadership skills focusing on four fundamental strands of school life: CARE, OUTREACH, VOICE and EXPERIENCE. Each is supported by a "heart to serve" orientation that goes beyond the development of leadership skills as our students look to engage in acts of service benefitting their peers, the school, and the broader community.

Through our programme, we aspire to nurture Clementeens with the confidence to unite and inspire others for the greater good, and to play an active role in promoting inclusivity and harmony within the community.

Primary 6 students who are committed to developing themselves in the area of Community Youth Leadership may apply for Direct School Admissions through the Talent Area of Leadership & Uniformed Groups. The Direct School Admission Exercise usually commences in May each year.





Life-long Learning Experiences

Care

- Focus on building a caring school culture through these specialised areas: cyber wellness, mental health and well-being and family education
- Facilitate peer bonding, peer helping and peer influencing so that they can be effective peer supports among students.

Experience

- Focus on building a vibrant school community and school culture through ad-hoc activities throughout the year
- Plan and support key school events such as festive celebrations and Teachers' Day celebrations

Outreach

- Focus on advocacy and outreach work, such as National Education messages and environmental conservation efforts
- In-charge of planning for VIA experience for Student Leaders

Voice

Applied Learning Programme





Mastery through Application and Research in STEM (M.A.R.S)

CTSS offers its ALP programme under the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) strand and seeks to develop our students to be Future-ready Clementeens who possess digital literacy and are architects of their own STEM learning.

All lower secondary students undergo the Tier 1 programme, where STEM-related skills and content knowledge are integrated in the Lower Secondary English, Mathematics and Science curriculum.

Students are introduced to the field of emerging technologies and the basics of computational thinking. In addition, they acquire and apply 21st century competencies of communication and collaboration skills, as well as critical and creative thinking through our Mastery through Application and Research in STEM (MARS) programme where students collaborate and work together in a group to brainstorm, identify, analyse a problem and ideate solutions which can be addressed through prototyping.

Students can further pursue their interests through Tier 2
Programme which comprise STEM enrichment opportunities and
mentorship programmes with external partners – Science-in-Action
Science Research Mentorship Programme, Competitive
Programming Talent Development Programme, Computing
and Al project mentorship and students can choose to offer
O-Level Computing as a subject in Upper Secondary.







Towards Holistic Education

Full Subject-Based Banding at Secondary Schools

Since 2024, all secondary schools have been implementing Full Subject-Based Banding (Full SBB).

Full SBB is part of MOE's ongoing efforts to nurture the joy of learning and cater to the different strengths and interests of students.

With Full SBB, students can take subjects at different levels of demand (indicated by the labels G1, G2, and G3). Students offer subjects at the level of demand that best caters to their strengths, interests and learning needs. At appropriate junctures, students will have the flexibility to adjust the levels of demand for the subjects offered. After graduation, students will also access post-secondary pathways based on their various subjects and subject level combinations.

The CCA-House System - a unique Full SBB Experience at CTSS

CTSS has been implementing Full SBB since 2020, as one of the first 28 pilot schools. Students are also grouped into four Houses based on their CCA.




The VIA @ CTSS also provides opportunities for students to contribute to and serve the community. VIA @ CTSS uses the Service-Learning project cycle and modified Design Thinking approach, where Clementeens are put through the 'Feel', 'Imagine', 'Do' and 'Share' stages where they learn to stand from the perspectives of another to better understand the real needs they face. Through this and under the guidance of their CCE teachers, Clementeens learn to become more empathetic members of society who have a heart to improve the life of others.



Furthermore, in conjunction with our School's Learning for Life Programme (LLP), which focuses on Community Youth Leadership, Clementeens who display an interest and aptitude in leading their peers to innovate ideas to better the lives of others, will also be provided with opportunities to engage external stakeholders in various projects that extend beyond the school-structured VIA Projects. It is our eventual hope that Clementeens will be proactive members of society who initiate their own VIA Projects to advocate for causes they feel strongly for.







A range of cultural activities, such as traditional handicraft, language workshops, Xin Yao Appreciation workshop and cultural learning journeys are organised to allow students to be exposed to their own Mother Tongue culture. Besides the Mother Tongue Language Fortnight Programme, the Department also organises the Mother Tongue Language Cultural Camp for all Secondary 2 students. Clementeens have the opportunities to participate in cultural-related workshops, cultural trails and learning journeys. This will deepen their understanding towards their Mother Tongue culture.

ASPIRE Cohort Activities

Sec 1 Learning to Use the Personal Learning Devices

Our Sec 1s received their own Personal Learning Device - the Apple iPad, and learned how to make use of different applications and features to manage their time, document their learning, and collaborate with others.

Our Sec 2s stepped into the shoes of the elderly to better understand their needs and the challenges they face, so that they will be able to plan meaningful Values-in-Action (VIA) projects for the elderly community.

Our Sec 3s worked together in their CCE classes, led by the CCE Representative under the guidance of CCAPs, to put together a cohort carnival for their peers and teachers to enjoy. This gave them a platform to exercise self and team-leadership through executing some real-world experiences that made their CCE lessons come alive.



Sec 4/5 Shark Tank and Night Hike

Our Sec 4 and 5 students learned to build their self-confidence and communication skills through our very own "Shark Tank" programme where students have to come up with their own marketing briefs to sell a product to a panel of teachers and parents. They also took part in our signature CTSS Night Hike, starting from the foot of Mount Faber, trekking as one cohort all the way back to school.

Sports Enrichment Programmes



Believing that physical fitness is a core component in the formative years of a teenager, CTSS organises annual sports events to ensure that Clementeens have a head start in cultivating a healthy lifestyle. Our Clementeens also learn psychomotor skills and values through team games. For instance, sports learned during Physical Education lessons such as netball, basketball, tchoukball, badminton, volleyball, frisbee and softball, culminate in students having the opportunity to represent their classes in the Annual Inter-House Games.



INTEGRITY & EMPATHY





An important aspect of the scientific process is inquiry, and this is a skill we want our Clementeens to cultivate. The Science-in-Action (SIA) programme is a research mentorship programme for talented and passionate student-scientists. It enables selected Secondary 2 and 3 students to discover, question and investigate scientific phenomena around them. Our students will also get the exciting opportunity to embark on a project under the mentorship of a teacher or an expert from tertiary institutions, such as the National University of Singapore.



Aesthetics



In our bid to develop passion and love for the Arts, our students are given plenty of opportunities to develop their interests. The school organises assembly programmes and post-examination activities which allow the students to showcase music and dance. Students get opportunities to demonstrate their talents through school-based competitions in song composition, singing and dancing.

Beyond participating as an audience for the art forms, our students explore the arts through a vibrant Art and Music curriculum, where they are taught the Elements of Art and instrumental and music composition skills (Keyboard, Percussion and IT-based music making). In Art lessons, they explore themes such as storytelling through different forms of drawing and painting. In addition, students learn to express their ideas using both 2-D and 3-D work. In Music lessons, Clementeens translate their learning through performances and showcase in front of their peers.

In 2023, Team CT Performing Arts groups put on their best performances at the Singapore Youth Festival, achieving 6 Certificates of Distinction and 2 Certificates of Accomplishment. These achievements were only possible through the diligence and commitment of Clementeens and teachers. In addition, the Performing Arts groups were also actively involved in performances for community events as part of our school's community outreach.



SELF-DISCIPLINE & RESPECT

H.E.Y. Programme

CTSS approaches the teaching of social-emotional competencies and application of personal leadership principles through a customised school-based CCE curriculum based on the '7 Habits for Highly Effective Youths' by Stephen Covey.

The 7 Habits Curriculum is integrated into CTSS's Lifelong Learning Programme, CCE lessons, CCA sessions, Cohort Camps and Learning Experiences. In our endeavour to make the 7 Habits a pervasive culture, all teachers are trained to facilitate the inculcation of these habits in the different student development experiences through reflection. Our hope is that Clementeens will live out these habits, have a mindset and skill sets to cope with adversity and thrive effectively beyond the gates of CTSS.
